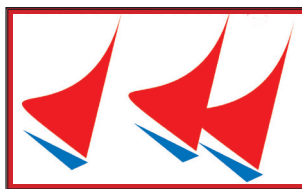


LaCrosse Sailing Club—

Lock and Dam No. 7 forms Pool 7 and Lake Onalaska, located on Mississippi River mile at 702.5 near La Crescent, Minnesota. It was constructed and placed in operation in April, 1937 and underwent major rehabilitation from 1989 through 2002.
